Steels Creek Community Centre Annual General Meeting Report



The Annual General Meeting of the SC Community Centre was held at 7:30PM on 23 August. The Treasurer's report was presented and accepted. It is available on the web site noted above. Geoff Keets reported on the state of the Centre and its sponsored groups. He thanked the Lowes for their support of the market, Chris for the *Jolly Thing*, Greg Leonard and others for maintaining the Centre and grounds, David Allan for coordinating the Clean Up Australia Day, the Stitchers for their Biggest Afternoon Tea, the Art Show

Coordinators for the fine event, and the other groups for their contributions to the local community.

The Community Centre Management Committee election results were: **Malcolm Calder**, President; **Alby Leckie**, Vice-president; **Keith Montell**, Treasurer; **Ed Bartosh**, Secretary, with **Geoff Keets**, **Greg Leonard**, **Vicky Stewart**, and **David Allan** elected as committee members.

There was a long discussion about the reported move to a new Community Centre building. This project was not being pursued by the Council, but was only a discussion point during the Tennis Club's request for a safe, offstreet parking area. There was considerable consternation about a perceived lack of communication and faulty communication on the issue. Malcolm Calder noted that he would establish a working group to meet with the Shire staff and review alternatives, such as upgrading the current facilities to other possibilities, which would be followed by a Community Special General Meeting for open review, discussion, and possible action. THE NEXT 15 YEARS

Special Community Meeting about the future of the Steels Creek Community Centre WEDNESDAY, 25 OCTOBER, 7.30 PM.

Recently the Shire has suggested that our Community Committee work with them to develop a cooperative management agreement, clearly setting out the management responsibilities of the Shire as property owner and the Community Committee as Committee of Management.

To help our Committee with this we really need to have clear ideas as a community about the current uses of the Centre and the likely future needs.

At the recent Annual General Meeting, I suggested that we should meet at one or more special community meetings to have wide ranging discussions as to the future of the Community Centre. These discussions will be an urgent priority over the next two months.

Our Community Centre Committee will prepare some ideas and options to help focus the discussion and these will be available at the meeting. At this meeting we will ask those interested to join a Working Group with the task of working with the Shire staff to develop a future plan to be put to the community for adoption. (We already have a number of people who, at the A.G.M. expressed interest in joining this Working Group).

The previous Steels Creek Community Committee had some exploratory discussions with the Shire regarding the possibility of consolidating the two major community properties (the Community Centre and the Tennis Club) by the purchase of land adjacent to the Tennis Club. These discussions included Cr Jeanette McRae, but there were no specific proposals developed for consideration by the community or the Shire

At this first Community Meeting on October 25 we want to hear all ideas as to the type of Centre we want to have going into the future. All suggestions, comments and ideas will be welcome.

New Invasive Weed Alert!

Wild tobacco is the latest newcomer to worry Melbourne Water, the Shire and residents in the district. It's a weed that has hit all creeks and rivers around Healesville, seen easily where Chum Creek Road crosses the Watts River. If you do see it here, please contact the Steels Creek Landcare Group or the Shire. If removing it, be careful as this one is a toxic member of the nightshade family. A strong smell of diesel gives it away. Wear gloves and a dust mask. Detailed advice on identifying and removing Wild Tobacco is available on the Steels Creek Landcare website at http://steelscreek.landcare.melbournewater.com.au

Do you love the smell of garlic in the morning?

It's that time of year again when our roadsides are all hushed and white with...onion weed from the Mediterranean? Each year, the dreaded stuff is appearing in more and more places, but there is a way to hold it back. For small patches, removal of bulbs by hand or with a garden fork is easy in wet soil.

For larger patches, one simple approach is to mow or slash the flowers before the plant seeds. Over a few years this method is very effective. In impossible situations, spraying with glyphosate will do the job but using it near drainage lines or near native vegetation can cause problems elsewhere, so spraying on a dry windless day is important. Timing is everything. Unfortunately the schedule for Shire slashing of our roadsides tends to favour angled onion after it has seeded, so getting it while still in flower is vital.


