## COMMUNITY CENTRE DEVELOPMENT PLAN ***ON HOLD***

We had hoped that by now we would be well into the project of developing a plan for the Steels Creek Community Centre. However, we are waiting on a condition and status report on the present Community Centre and associated buildings from the Shire. This report will be available shortly. On Monday Nov. 27 the property consultants that manage Shire properties spent a couple of hours looking around and taking notes so we really can expect a report, perhaps before Christmas!

We are sorry it is taking so long to get things underway, but really it is essential for us to understand any issues or constraints we may face in thinking through our plan. There really is no point in holding meetings without this information. We are doing our best to hurry things along and we have strong support from Councillor Jeanette McRae to get the plan completed.

In the mean time we have spoken with several of our community groups and with Shire staff, and we believe that there is a good deal of consensus regarding our overall needs for an appropriate Community Centre. We will be preparing notes from the ideas we have been given, including those from the Annual General Meeting and Special Community Meeting last month. Once we get the Shire report we expect to hold the first Working Group meeting as soon as possible after that, and there will be a report outlining progress in the next Jolly Thing, due out at the start of February, 2007.

We apologise for this delay, but in the end the information we are waiting for will speed up our discussions once they start. Please contact members of the Community Committee if you have any comments or ideas you want included in the discussions. All ideas are welcome.

***“The McPhersons of Yarra Glen ” Reissue of 1992 Classic***

***Your chance to own a piece of local history***

Although well recognised by local historians as a key contribution to the story of European settlement in the Kangaroo Ground and Yarra Glen area, Muriel Watson's book has, to date, remained somewhat of a 'secret treasure'. Being a private publication, copies were never abundant and the work has therefore not received wide public exposure. *The McPhersons of Yarra Glen* was originally published privately by the author, Muriel Watson, in 1992.

A large number of other local family names appear throughout the work and are placed in clear genealogical context. A surprising number of local lineages are shown to intertwine with the McPherson family line. Moreover, the author shares with the reader details of numerous relationships of McPherson family members with friends, neighbours and townspeople.

A very comprehensive index, compiled by YG&DHS member Helen Mann, has been added in this edition and will greatly aid any reader or researcher in accessing the abundance of local references contained in this work.

## Supermarket Progress Report

"On Tuesday, November 28 Yarra Ranges Shire Council agreed to ask the Minister of Planning to appoint a panel to consider all submissions made about the Supermarket development in Yarra Glen. This is a normal process adopted by local governments in Victoria when very controversial planning matters come up for discussion. There was only standing room left in the public gallery when the matter came to Council and the greater majority of those present expressed their opposition to the Amendment. Spokesperson for the objectors, former Healesville Shire Councillor Veronica Holland, presented a very strong case as to why the motion should be abandoned. While Chris O'Connor, on behalf of the developers, outlined the group's commitment to establishing the wetland area and the lengths his group had gone to meet community concerns regarding the building and car park site.

In supporting the position the Shire has adopted, Councillor Jeanette McRae explained later that the appointment of a panel would enable all the submissions, for and against, to be clarified and considered more objectively. The motion asks the panel to **"advise on design issues associated with: the functional integration of the proposed development with the Yarra Glen town centre; the location of the proposed car park; the scale and visual impact of the proposed building; and its impact on residential amenity"**. These reflect the main issues raised by many objectors.

All those who have made submissions will be given the opportunity to appear before the panel, probably in February or March, to put their case and answer questions. The Panel Report will come back to the Shire 4 - 6 weeks after the hearings for further consideration and eventual adoption or abandonment. In other words, debate is not yet finished and if you want to have your say you should contact Cr McRae or write to the Shire."

**At last we have some money!** The long awaited grant from the Enviro fund has at last materialised in our bank account giving us the funds to start the weed control and planting program we have been talking about for months.

We were strongly advised not to commit any of the funds until we actually received them. This proved to be good advice as it has taken nine months from starting the application to actual receipt of funds. The delay has probably saved us a lot of heartache as, if we had planted in winter/spring, by now we would be watching young plants dry up. We now have time to prepare for autumn/winter planting if the drought breaks.

Meanwhile the council has completed clearance pruning along Steels Creek Rd. and has done a pretty neat job. Now mowing is well advanced, normally I complain that they mow too early before native wildflowers have set seed, but not this year most are well and truly dry.

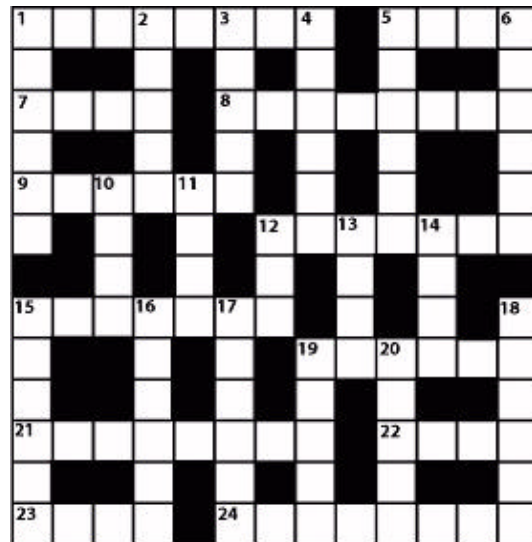
