Malcolm Calder reported on the state of the Centre and its sponsored groups. The year 2006/07 has been a busy and fruitful year for the Centre. We worked with the SYR to determine the needs of this facility and formed a working group to evaluate options for the future of the Centre (the minutes of the working group are on the documents page of the web site). The good news is that the Shire has budgeted \$15,000 for maintenance of the Centre building and has also awarded us a \$15,000 grant for health and safety fixes to the inside of the building. Malcolm thanked the active groups and individuals who make up and provide vitality to the Centre.

Late last summer as I lay in the hammock looking up at the leafy canopy of our English oak, no better therapy for the relief of stress after a working week, I reflected on the trees we had planted and why.

The oak was from an acorn from a tree at my parents house, my Mother called it a Spider Oak and looking up I can see why, it spreads its limbs long and angled like a spiders legs. The Tulip tree to my left was also favourite tree of my Mother, we used to sell the flowers for thruppence to the local florist, though they were not easy to collect as the tree was tall, ours has only produced one flower after being in for a good 7 years, I will lean the axe against it this year to give it a hint. The liquid ambers to my far right were also trees in my parent's garden, the fragrant smell of the leaves I can still sense when we burnt them in autumn, a no no now a days of course. Also to my far right is our hedge, we call it Elizabeth after a friend who helped plan it and whose head of hair grows rampant like the hedge. The cuttings came from the Ashcombe Maze on the Mornington Peninsula. In front of me are the flowering cherries, one planted by a Skyhook, the band member not a crane, both turning into their autumn hue. To my left the strong green conical shape of the silver spruce, one of the few remnants from my nursery days, it has thrived through wind, frost and drought.

At this stage with the soft murmurings of the parrots nibbling the seed of the Chinese elms, I drifted off to sleep, only to be rudely awakened by the hammock ropes giving way and depositing me flat on my back on the ground.

Back to work, therapy over!

ONION INVASION

Did you know that one of the greatest threats to bio-diversity in Australia, second only to land clearing, is invasion by weeds?

The relentless nature of weeds is no more evident than in the steady march of angled onion along Steels Creek's roadsides.

Where physical removal of the whole plant is not possible, the timely removal of angled onion's flowers reduces its spread significantly by stopping the plant from seeding. Over a couple of seasons like this, the plant is visibly weaker. The stretch of roadside just to the south of the community centre shows how effective slashing is, especially when integrated with a spraying program.

Please take some time in coming weeks to remove as many of the flowers as you can in your area, especially at the fringes of any infestation or in small outbreaks. The best time is just as the flower is beginning to wilt. This helps prevent the plant from flowering a second time.

OH DEER WHAT CAN THE MATTER BE?

Steels Creek Landcare is applying for funding through the Port Phillip and Westernport Catchment Management Authority (PPWCMA) to embark on a three year integrated pest animal management project to investigate management options for the problem of feral and/or native animals damaging tree plantings and crops. This effort is expected to be an inter-agency effort involving local land holders, together with the Shire of Yarra Ranges, Melbourne Water, the Australian Deer Association, the Kinglake National Park and your local Landcare group.

Initial activities are being planned to determine the extent of the problem and to then develop appropriate responses. Activities are expected to include surveys to determine which properties are affected, a joint information and educational session to raise awareness and a demonstration project to trial options. Participants in Melbourne Water's Stream Frontage Management Program and Greening Australia tree planting programmes as well as landholders experiencing tree and crop damage are invited to come forward to participate. Expressions of interest about receiving further information or participating in this project are now being sought.

Most of us are not up at three in the morning to see the animals but find broken tree limbs and damaged foliage later in the day. Browser or grazer? Deer or marsupial? How to tell? What to do?

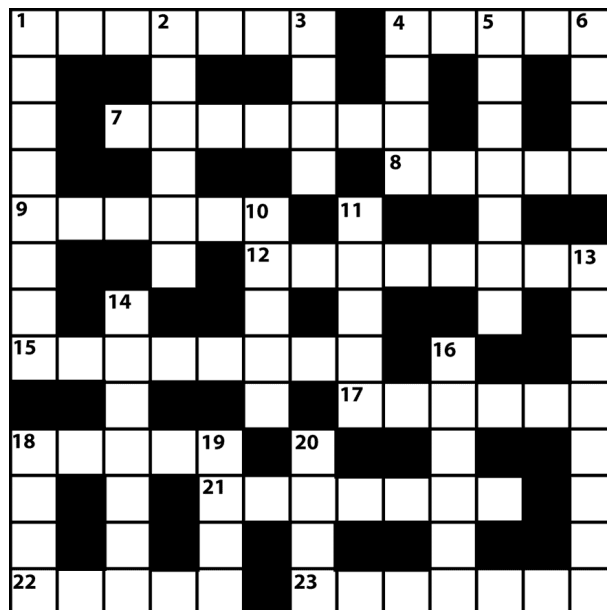
