Red Shed Café Italian Night.

On Friday 8 May, 26 of our closest friends and associates headed off to the Red Shed Café in Gruyere for an absolutely fantastic Italian feast.

First, we were presented with an incredibly generous shared platter (well three platters actually!) of stunning antipasto consisting of zucchini capecce, grilled eggplant with balsamic and basil, pea and mint frittata, rosemary bruschetta and Italian salami. All absolutely superb and I was full after this.

BUT next came slow roasted shanks in balsamic served with parsnip mash, pear, rocket and parmesan salad.

Copious glasses of wine were enjoyed by all from the cellars of **Medhurst Vineyard**.

The deserts were unbelievable. Vanilla panacotta, poached pears in red wine with chocolate (to die for!!) puddings. Everybody was served one of each!!! All this was for \$45.00 per head. A true feast served with warmth and humour.

Proposed book - 'Black Saturday at Steels Creek'

As you may have heard, earlier this month a group of historians visited Steels Creek at the invitation of some residents. They felt that the events of 7 February had profound effects on the community - not least in the destruction of many homes and in people's deaths - and that those effects needed to be documented and acknowledged. Accordingly, Jane and Malcolm Calder contacted Tom Griffiths of the Australian National University. Tom is an environmental historian who had published a book *Forests of Ash*, a history of the Victorian forest country, and he has written pieces commenting on the Black Saturday fires one of which was published in the last *The Jolly Thing*.

Acting on this invitation, Tom asked several colleagues to join him. They are Moira Fahy, who has made films and websites about other bush fires (notably the 1939 Victorian fires) and one of his research students at ANU, Christine Hansen. ANU has a close relationship with the nearby National Museum of Australia, and Tom asked me if I'd be interested in joining his team. I run the Museum's Centre for Historical Research, and soon saw that I could contribute to this project. I've written a lot of military history - twenty-odd books, many about battles - and I thought that I could understand another sort of chaotic, traumatic event, like a bush fire. Together, we visited Steels Creek in mid-May. We saw the signs of the fires and met a few people, and we decided that we could each do something to respond to what happened to your community.

I'll leave to Moira, Tom and Christine to write about their projects in future issues of *The Jolly Thing*. As a result of what I saw and heard when we visited, I would like to outline how I feel I can best help your community. I'm planning to write a book, provisionally called 'Black Saturday at Steels Creek'. It will try to describe what happened on 7 February. It will probably draw on press reports, and perhaps on CFA or Shire records, if they are available. But its main source will be the memories of the people affected - many of them readers of *The Jolly Thing*.

Over the next twelve months or so I'm planning to visit Steels Creek several times, to meet and interview people. A local person, **Hannah Sky** who lost her house will also be interviewing people, so between us we would hope to collect a wide range of accounts. I'd like to make contact with anyone who might be willing to help us work out what happened. I'm happy to hear from you and to document your stories in any way you feel able - in writing or in person. You may already have written accounts of the fires for families or friends, or may be willing to be interviewed. My goal is to gather as wide a range of stories as possible, to reflect the range of the events of that day and its immediate aftermath.

To be honest, I had never even heard of Steels Creek until a couple of months ago. Now the events of 7 February will become the most important part of my work at the National Museum for about the next year. I'm keen to start work, and feel privileged to help to tell a story that has moved those of us who read and saw the news reports of what happened to Victoria three months ago. As an historian, I can't re-build fences, houses or lives. But I can use my skills to understand and explain what happened, so that Steels Creek's experience will at least be recorded and remembered. I'd very much like to hear from you, and would love to meet you when I visit.

I'm planning to be at the **25 July** market day at the **Community Centre** - please come to chat then. Bushfire Class Action

There is to be a Bushfire Class Action and related community meeting **6.30 pm** this **Thursday night** at the **Yarra Glen Racecourse**. Maurice Blackburn and Slidders Lawyers are jointly conducting a class action on behalf of all persons who suffered loss as a result of the KEK Fire Complex.

The claim is against SP AusNet by reason of negligence or breach of duty of care to properly design and maintain a particular power line, located in Kilmore East. We believe the breaking of this line was the ignition source of the KEK Fire Complex. Towns affected include Arthurs Creek, Break O Day, Castella, Christmas Hills, Clonbinane, Coulson Crossing, **Dixons Creek**, Eagle Nest, Flowerdale, Glenburn, Glenvale, Hazeldene, Heathcote Junction, Humevale, Kilmore East, Kinglake, Kinglake Central, Kinglake West, Mittons Bridge, Pheasant Creek, Reedy Creek, Saint Andrews, Saint Andrews North, **Steels Creek**, Strath Creek, Strathewen, Tarrowarra, Toolangi, Upper Plenty, Wall Crossing, Wandong, Waterford Park, Yabamac and Yarra Glen.

- Is the Steels Creek Community Centre the place for a "Men's Shed"? Some alternatives have been mentioned such as the Yarra Glen Living and Learning Centre or the Old Scout Hall near the southern end of Steels Creek Road. Would you use the resources of a Men's Shed?
- The idea of a community garden at SC3 with individuals taking responsibility for the management of a particular plot or allotment has come up as an idea. Do you need a garden plot; would you use a garden plot; is there enough space and suitable access for garden plots at the Community Centre?

Recovery

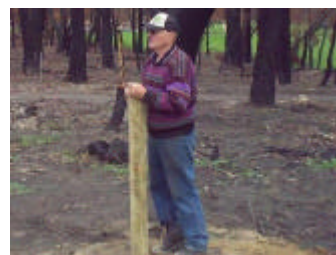
I'm impatient Nature's not from Rudi Anders poem And Nature sent fire

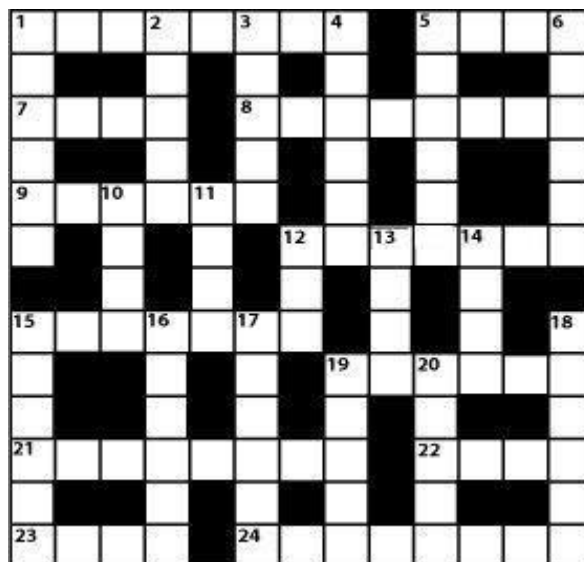
