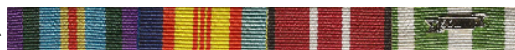
Saturday Tennis: Saturday competitions continue after the school holidays. Come show your support from 1pm on Saturdays (see the JT calendar for dates of play).

Food Writers Report

On Saturday 23 July we as a family had a most enjoyable and interesting dinner at **Mt Rael**. We had signed up for the "Dinner with the Artist and a Private Showing of the Archibald Finalists at *Tarra Warra*".

It was \$160 per head, but that included canapés and five or so glasses of Champagne whilst we waited for the other guests and Song Lee, the artist, to arrive. When all were assembled we sat down to a delightful repast.

Entrée choices consisted of scallops with quenelles of mushy peas and a fried disc of black pudding, a great veloute of Jerusalem artichoke soup with truffle oil floating on top or a single raviolo of crab and ricotta.

For the main course some, chose the Atlantic salmon on potato rosti, whilst others went for the twice cooked duck. The true carnivores ordered the beef, eye fillet on the bone, most unusual and giant sized.

I had the entrée soup and scallops, just perfect for me as next came sweets: chocolate fondant or appletartine of mandarin on a shortbread biscuit.

Everyone not only enjoyed the food and the free flowing inclusive wine (the ice riesling as a dessert wine was a knock out), but greatly appreciated Song Lee and the detailed stories about the Archibald. Song Lee had painted himself in pixels with multi shopping bags, depicting the intense consumerism that is afflicting Chinese affluent society. A timely comment.

Yarra River Levels

Along with my general interest in the fluctuating height of our Yarra River, my main focus is when the level rises above 2.6 metres, as that is when water will start flowing into the Yarra Flats Billabongs.

Since August last year there have been 16 separate occasions when these high river events have occurred. By comparison, during the previous five years, there was one high river event in 2009, none in 2008, one in 2007, none in 2006 and three in 2005.

As an indication of how waterlogged the Yarra catchment is at the moment, for the month of July, there have only been 3 days when the river level was below 2.6 metres and the mean, as at 25th July, it was at 3.1 metres. For 15 consecutive days it was above 3.0 metres.

It's True What They Say About The Belladonna Lily

The Belladonna Lily – *amaryllis belladonna* – is a tough, drought tolerant survivor..Who could forget their waving pink flowers brightening up the blackened landscape in March 2009. In the last few weeks of February and the first few weeks of March, up they pop along Steels Creek Road first and then in our garden. That was until this year.

Now I know the belladonna can be a bit finicky about the depth it is planted, generally half in and half out. And it has the ability to adjust its depth and won't flower until it is happy with it. The bulbs I have were obtained from Joe & Pat up the hill from us, and flowered after being planted adjoining the croquet lawn in 2005. They continued to do so up until this year.

As soon as I saw the belladonna flowers along Steels Creek Road this year I knew that ours were due in a few weeks. But when I went to check on their progress I saw that there were no signs of flowers forming. Then I realized what had happened. The enthusiastic Bill-the-Gardener had whipper-snipped the area where they were planted (how the grass had grown this year!), and whilst not actually cutting into the bulbs, Bill had scared them into not flowering this year. A rap over knuckles for Bill, and he has been told to stick to maintaining the croquet lawn and nothing else.

As a consolation prize, five flowers appeared from where I have removed some lower limbs of a Chinese elm that I had planted three years ago. This was the first time they had flowered.

And some time later, up popped the pink ones, but not the white, as if to prove the point.
