Andrew Chapman

As most people will be aware, Andrew Chapman died in early August, after his lengthy battle with cancer. News of his passing was circulated in *The Steels Creek Grapevine* at that time. As Andrew and his family wished, there was no funeral service, but two Memorial gatherings for Andrew were arranged, one at South Yarra Lawn Tennis Club, and another at Steels Creek. The Steels Creek gathering was held at the Community Centre, after the Market, on 23rd August.

At the Steels Creek gathering, David Allan and Malcolm Calder recalled some of their memories of Andrew, and his numerous and significant contributions to the Steels Creek community. These included reference to his years of work on the Community Centre Committee (including his roles as vice-president and acting president), his editing of *The Jolly Thing*, his setting up of *The Grapevine* after the bushfires, hosting of croquet tournaments and his many illustrated vignettes on aspects of life around Steels Creek often published in these pages. Mention was also made of his ready willingness to lend a hand where ever needed, and the amazing spirit that he showed in the face of adversity. Alexandra also spoke of her memories of her Dad, including what it was sometimes like to live with a dedicated Collingwood supporter! As she spoke, a photo-presentation of Andrew's life and times ran on the Community Centre's Big Screen.

Andrew was a person who loved Steels Creek and who lived life to the full. Our Steels Creek community will remember him with gratitude and affection.

Council's Mobile Phone Black-spot Advocacy

Readers may be aware that for some time there has been contact between Steels Creek mobile phone users and a number of other people and organisations, concerning the often poor or non-existent mobile phone coverage that is experienced in many parts of Steels Creek. One of the organisations is the Yarra Ranges Council. Without attempting to go over all that has transpired to date, the following is the text of a letter recently received by Athel Smith (Hunts Lane) from Lou Zarro, Economic Development Unit, Yarra Ranges Council. It is reproduced here for the information of Steels Creek mobile phone users. **If residents or phone users would like to find out more about what is happening with this significant issue, please contact Athel on 5965 2368.**

On Friday, 26 September 2014, Lou wrote:

Thought I would connect to give you an update on Council's mobile black spot advocacy efforts.

Apologies for not connecting sooner. Part of the reason for the silence might be because I was on leave for two months.

I am happy to say there has been some solid work done on advocacy on the mobile black-spot in the time I've been away.

From the Department of Communications we have received a request for some further information in May and again last month. As it stands the Department are still finalising the list for the priority sites they will fund and have been investigating how Councils will work with mobile network operators and others to consider any statutory planning issues and other support to assist the rollout process.

Council on this is well prepared. To understand the sort of relationships and support that needs to be in place Council has hosted a meeting with Tony Smith and Paul Fletcher, Parliamentary Secretary for Communications, to discuss the priority locations. The meeting was very positive and provided an opportunity for us to better understand how the programme will be rolled out. In conjunction with Tony Smith we arranged a meeting three weeks ago with Optus representatives to discuss our three priority locations. This was also a positive meeting and we got a really strong feeling that Optus definitely want to invest substantially in the municipality.

I now intend to set up a meeting with the State Government to maintain the focus and to firm up their support. The competent Minister Gordon Rich-Phillips will be visiting in early October on other government business so we will make a strong representation to him about the case for Steels Creek and our other sites as high-priority locations. Please pass on this update to other community members.

At a recent meeting, the Committee of the Yarra Glen Art Show (YGAS) discussed plans for the biennial Art Show to be held over Labour-day weekend, March 2015. As in 2013, the Show will be in the Yarra Glen Memorial Hall and we expect a great turn out of both artists and participants. Since 2002, when it was held in a marquee on the lawn in front of what was then known as 'Cheese Freaks', the Show has grown to be a major community-based tourist event in Yarra Glen. In 2013 there were over 500 entries and a turnover of nearly \$30,000. Volunteers have been the mainstay of the Show and profits have gone to major children's charities as well as local CFA's and schools. For the next Show we will be contracting a Manager to cope with the growing tasks of administration, data management and finances.

Our aims are: to create a significant art event for the Yarra Valley;
to provide a quality event for our local artists and art community;
to place art alongside food, wine, antiques, racing etc., as major tourist attractions for Yarra Glen.

Feathered Friends!

After chatting recently with Birder friends (it appears Birders are rather more laid-back in their interest than Twitchers), we decided to count up the number of bird species that have visited our property since we arrived in Steels Creek twelve years ago. We were amazed to discover that we could recall over forty different species. This number does include birds that we may have only seen once, such as the Barn Owl that visited us the week we moved in (we felt he was checking our suitability as residents), a rather large, young Cuckoo Shrike we were amazed to see being fed by numerous little birds of differing types and a Pelican we spotted flying overhead. The Azure Kingfisher we see very rarely always gives us a thrill but our favourites are probably the beautiful King Parrots who are regular visitors, the gossipy Gang-gangs and the Yellow-tailed Black Cockatoos. There are also the White Cheeked Honeyeaters and smart little Eastern Spine Bills that we watch through the kitchen window as they feed on the blossoms in the garden and the Scarlet Robins after which our property is named. There are also the Blue Wrens, the Spotted Pardalotes, not to mention the truly magnificent Wedge-tailed Eagles that soar overhead, the pushy, noisy family of Choughs, the shy little Brown Quail.....

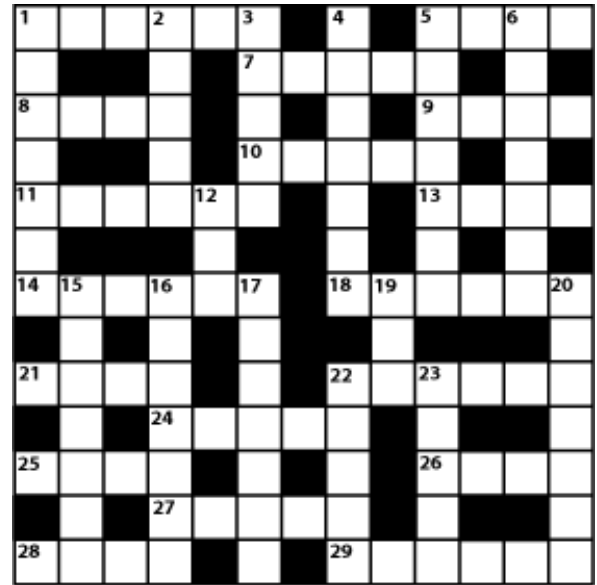
