Vera Adams Civics and Citizenship Award

For several years now, SCCC has sponsored one of the awards that are presented to children at the school as they complete their sixth grade year, prior to their moving on to secondary education.

The award is known as the *Vera Adams Civics and Citizenship Award* in memory of the late Vera Adams. Vera was a long-time teacher at the Steels Creek Primary School before its closure and transition to the current Community Centre. Vera is remembered by many of her former students and their families with great respect and affection. She continued to live in Steels Creek as a valued member of our community until a few years before her death some eight years ago.

Initially, an award honouring Vera's memory was established with the Yarra Glen School to recognise a grade six student who demonstrated a significant interest in local history. However, this was later changed to acknowledge a student who has consistently displayed empathy and consideration toward his or her peers. It considers personal attributes that the student has displayed, enthusiasm and motivation for self-improvement as well as positive interaction with others in the school community and involvement with intra-school activities such as SRC, cross-age responsibilities, school social or welfare activities.

Each year the School recommends a student for the award, and a book prize is presented by a representative of SCCC at the school's Grade Six Graduation ceremony in December. **The award for 2014 was presented to Tahlee Ferguson** at an Award Ceremony on 18th December last, by SCCC Inc. President, David Allan. It was an impressive occasion, organised and largely run by the grade six students themselves, with their Principal, teachers, parents, friends and others present.

The SCCC Committee believes that sponsoring this award helps encourage an awareness of the value of Community amongst young people, a value that many in the Steels Creek area will recognise and appreciate.

Aimed at properties 10-20 acres (4 to 8 hectares) there will be information on how to maximize your pasture, minimize your weeds and improve your soils. Many in the valley have had trees felled, which are too big to move on their own. We plan to nominate one or two weekends in April where as **a community we help each other to get ready for the winter fires**. Log splitting is easy work if there are three or more people available. However, many in our community only have one or two adults in their household or the physical work is beyond their capability. The new Landcare log splitter makes the job very easy.

The expectation is that people whose wood is to be split will assist where they can (even if it's just making a cuppa for the workers). Those who are volunteering their time will be organized into suitable times so we don't exhaust anyone.

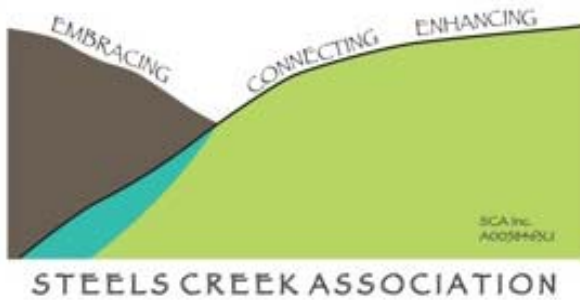
Brushstrokes

Weather Report

The low rainfall period has continued with December 20 mm below average and January 24 mm below average. The total for 2014 was 135 mm below average with only 3 months slightly above average (average being Bureau of Meteorology records for Yarra Glen - 1890 to 1974). Steels Creek, Dixons Creek and Pauls Creek all had stopped flowing in late December. 2014 was Victoria's warmest year on record for maximum temperatures and second warmest for mean temperatures. Seven of Australia's ten warmest years have occurred since 2002.

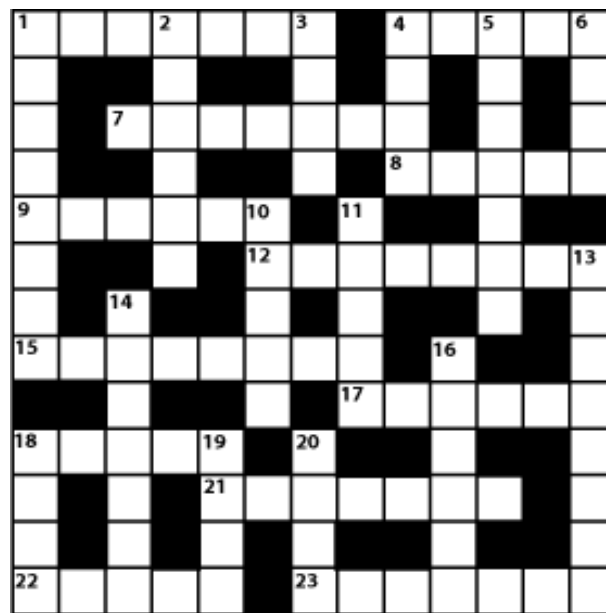
