Yarra Glen Art Show – an Artistic and a Community Success Story

The Yarra Glen Art Show is now over and the organising committee will be having its wind up meeting later this month. This was our 12th Art Show and the second one in the Memorial Hall. The Show attracted around 3,000 visitors and we sold some \$13,200 worth of art works. A full report will be included in the next Jolly Thing.

This Show was a wonderful community effort and a great example of the capacity of volunteers, when working together, to boost the public profile of Yarra Glen. First, we can thank the tenants of the Memorial Hall for giving us all the rooms and facilities for a full week. Then there were the community groups like the Yarra Glen and District Living and Learning Centre, the Chamber of Commerce and the CFA who supported us with both physical help and money. Under the guidance of Yarra Valley Gifts, the traders of Yarra Glen and some 18 ladies from the Centre and the Steels Creek Stitchers joined in creating the Bell Street display of colourful fabric roses. The Men's Shed built us a stand-alone "Art Show" sign, and all the printing and design work for posters and stationery came from Acme et al. Once again, Hoogies of Yarra Glen lent us the farm gates on which the pictures were hung — they have now become an iconic feature of the Art Show. Margaret McLoughlin and Raelene Sharp were our judges and we thank them for their very comprehensive efforts. This year Linden Gate Gallery gave an award to the best work by an artist under 25 and we thank them for this innovation.

Thank you to all the people who helped us stage the Show and especially, Debra Traill from the Living and Learning Centre and the hard working committee of eight. They turned out to be the dream team and everyone did their job brilliantly.


No Women's Group in April

Steels Creek Community Centre Constitution – Finally Finalised!

Those of us with lengthy memories will recall that we amended the SCCC Inc. Constitution in November 2013. The amendment was approved by Consumer Affairs Victoria in February 2014. However, CSV advised that we had omitted to include certain matters (that at the time we had believed we did not need to include), and pointed out Model Rules that were relevant, and which did in fact apply. Subsequent discussion with CAV clarified that the additional Model Rules could be added to our amended Constitution as an Appendix, also referencing the CSV's letter of advice. A formal 'Amendment of Constitution' process is not required to do this.

(Continued) This Appendix has now been prepared and added to the SCCC Inc. Constitution. The additional rules do not affect the usual operations of SCCC Inc., or its clubs and organisations. As readers may recall, Peter Stanley authored *Black Saturday at Steels Creek*, documenting just what did happen to us during the confusing twenty-four hours of Black Saturday. Peter has recently donated several copies of his book to the Community Centre, and they are available on the Library shelves. If you would like a copy, please contact David Allan. Peter is now a Professor at the University of New South Wales, Canberra at the Australian Defence Force Academy. He has published more books since *Black Saturday at Steel's Creek* in 2013. In 2014 he published *Lost Boys of Anzac* – about the very first wave men to land and who died on Gallipoli on 25 April 1915, and the effects of their deaths on their families. *Lost Boys of Anzac* is published by NewSouth and is available in bookshops.

Late in 2014 Bobby Graham Publishers released Peter's second novel, *The Cunning Man*. It is a who-dunnit-cum-romance set in British India during the first Anglo-Sikh war. Weather Report

The dry period has continued with February being 10 mm below average and March 23 mm below. Temperature wise, all of the Melbourne area was above average for the summer period with Coldstream having the warmest average of 27.4° which was 0.6° above average. In spite of this neither Coldstream nor Melbourne had a maximum temperature of 40° or above during summer, with the highest for both being 39°.

Of general interest is that the Melbourne observations are no longer recorded at the station in the small triangle on the corner of Latrobe Street and Victoria Street, where it had been operating since 1908, but are now recorded at a new station at Olympic Park. This new station will be less affected by swirling winds caused by tall buildings and the heat bank impact of surrounding concrete, asphalt and masonry.


