As notified elsewhere, the Annual General Meeting of Steels Creek Community Centre Inc. (SCCC) will be held on Wednesday 9th September next. Part of the business of the meeting will be election of the Committee for the coming year. The Committee will comprise an executive (President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary) plus five ordinary members, of which **two shall be nominated representatives of Steels Creek clubs** (cl.24(1)(b) of the SCCC Constitution).

All clubs, associations, groups (clubs) who use SCCC are reminded that they may nominate a representative to take one of the two committee positions referred to above (cl. 24(4)). Please note that **Club positions are NOT reserved for any particular club**. The intent behind reserving two committee places for Steels Creek clubs is to enable all clubs to seek to participate in management of SCCC. If more than two nominations from clubs are received, the Committee shall determine which nominations may be accepted.

All clubs are therefore requested to consider nominating a representative, and to complete a nomination form (available from the Secretary or at SCCC) to do so. Nominations must be in the hands of the Secretary at least seven days prior to the date of the meeting. Studio Space available at Butterfly Studio

Butterfly Studio is a beautiful little community art studio located within the grounds of the Christmas Hills Mechanics Institute Hall. It's just up the round from Steels Creek and some of you may know us from the felting, drawing and mosaic sessions we have run in Steels Creek! We have a limited amount of studio time available for hire for personal art practise. These sessions must be booked for the whole term (or longer) and can be on a weekly, fortnightly or monthly basis. The bookings can be for individuals or groups. The studio is ready and set up as a dedicated art space. It has plenty of work tables, chairs, a split system, running water, a fridge, microwave, tea/coffee making facilities, crockery and cutlery, a large whiteboard and pin board, and access to a disabled toilet. The much larger Christmas Hills Hall can also be booked if you require a larger venue for events. The studio view is across beautiful bush paddocks and the hills beyond. There is ample parking and disabled access. Studio hire rates are very reasonable at \$10 per hour (negotiable) plus a \$2 contribution per person and a commitment to clean up after yourselves. STEELS CREEK GETS MOBILE BLACKSPOT FUNDING

On Friday 26 June, our Federal member Tony Smith, along with Paul Fletcher, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Communications (Malcolm Turnbull), met with some very happy members of the Steels Creek Association at the SCCC to provide some details about our community's success in being nominated to receive funding as part of the 4G mobile blackspot program.

It has been confirmed that Telstra will be installing a base station that will cover Steels Creek to a significant extent (with other networks being able to co-locate on this station). With any luck, it could be as early as the end of this year. In any case, the roll-out of 500 base stations across the country is to take three years, with as many as possible being installed as quickly as possible in that time.

The SCA started discussions with Tony Smith in July 2013, as a result of the concerns over lack of mobile phone coverage expressed in the 'community needs' survey conducted in the early part of that year. Three years on, following a number of community meetings and discussions with Yarra Ranges Council, who have been advocating on our behalf for the past year, the news announced in Parliament on Thursday 25 June, and confirmed with phone calls from Tony Smith to SCA reps that afternoon, was welcome news indeed.

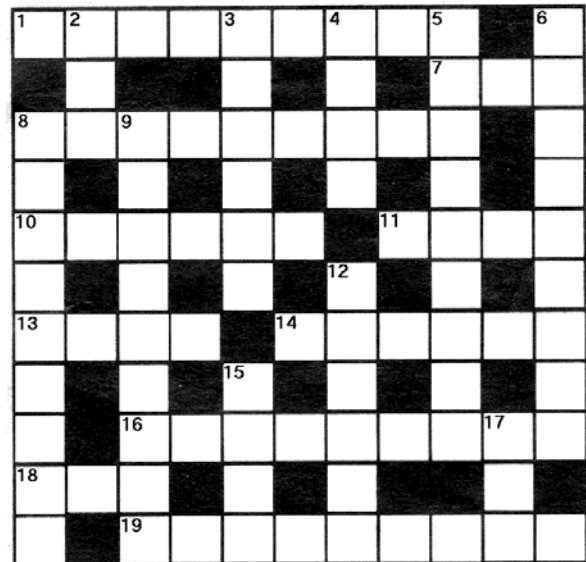
