Volunteer Students are again available to work with Steels Creek Landcare

Do you need any help around your property? Volunteers are again available to assist landowners to undertake a range of tasks. Activities, which you might describe as "high volume low complexity", have previously included tree planting, firewood stacking, fence removal, property tidy up, weed control plus a whole lot more.

The current volunteers groups are made up of 8 to 10 students with 1 to 3 supervisors.

Basic tools, gloves and high visibility vests are supplied. Depending on the task/s to be undertaken, you may also need to organise appropriate tools yourself, e.g .wheelbarrows, shovels etc. We do ask that you also provide some light refreshment for the students if possible.

Steels Creek Art Group – The First 25 Years

If you drive along Steels Creek Road any Thursday afternoon you will see several cars parked at the Community Centre. It is the weekly gathering of people who make up the Steels Creek Art Group and this year we celebrate 25 years since our very first gathering. although no one is quite sure exactly when we had our first meeting, It was soon after the closure of the Steels Creek Primary School in 1991 and just after the formation of the S.C. Garden Club.



The Art Group has no formal membership. It operates within the constitution of the Steels Creek Community Centre Inc. as a “user group”. Initially there were 5 of us – Gwen Leckie,, John Lowe (dec.), Jenny Tetlow, Helen Todhunter (dec) and me, Malcolm Calder. As a starter, we had a few drawing classes with Ivey Arney, an established artist and former resident of Steels Creek who was then living in Coldstream. In addition, some of us attended other workshops and classes as a way of developing our skills and finding out just what sort of art we enjoyed. We were all very much beginners.

Over the 25 years a number of people have joined the group, some for just one or a few visits some for longer periods and some as “regulars”. At the moment there are around 12 people from Steels Creek, Dixon’s Creek, Yarra Glen, Healesville, Glenburn and Mooroolbark who turn up on a fairly regular basis. Several of us have exhibited our paintings in local art shows, and galleries, even winning awards and commendations, and we have held a group exhibition at Gallery 34 in Yea. As a group we have twice taken part in the Yarra Valley Open Studios, most recently in 2017.



Black Saturday was crisis time for the Community Centre. It was effectively saved by Ivan Filsell and his boys when they saw that the building was under threat. We continued to use the school in the immediate weeks following the fire but were very fortunate to have Margaret Brewster’s studio in Yarra Glen as a place to meet during the construction of the new hall and toilets at the Centre. With funding from the Bushfire Recovery Fund we have held two Master Class workshops lead by Rayelene Sharp and Janet Hayes – both great days.



The Steels Creek Art Group has really grown and is well established as a successful community group that has become a self-sustaining and well recognised local support group. To celebrate these last 25 years we have arranged to hold a group



WEATHER REPORT

The dry conditions have continued in our valley with June rainfall 11 mm below average, although there was some variation across the Melbourne area with some parts having average totals but with Melbourne Airport 29 mm above average & Coldstream 12 mm above. A bit further afield Kilmore Gap was 40 mm above average largely due to 47 mm falling on the 18th. Our July total was 24 mm below average with Coldstream 16 mm below & Melbourne 28 mm below.

Temperatures for June were mostly close to average for maximum temperatures within the Melbourne area but minimum temperatures were between 1° & 1.5° below average.

For July, Coldstream maximum temperatures were 0.5° above average & minimum temperatures 0.6° above average, while July temperatures for Melbourne were 1.3° above average for maximums & 2.8° above average for minimums.
